

VILLAGE OF FARMERSVILLE
Minutes of Village Council Meeting
February 10, 2014

The Farmersville Village Council met in regular session on Monday, February 10, 2014 in the Village of Farmersville Council Chambers at 117 E. Walnut St. Mr. Weller called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm and Mr. Miller led the group in prayer; the Pledge of Allegiance was recited and was followed by a roll call.

COUNCIL MEMBERS PRESENT: Mr. Miller, Mr. Craig, Ms. Morgan, Ms. Attaway, Ms. Gisewite, Mr. Weller.

Ms. Gisewite moved, Ms. Attaway seconded to approve the minutes of January 27, 2014 with two corrections. Roll Call: Mr. Craig: yes, Ms. Morgan: abstain, Ms. Gisewite: yes, Ms. Attaway: yes, Mr. Weller: yes, Mr. Miller: yes. MOTION PASSED.

Ms. Gisewite moved, Ms. Attaway seconded to approve the bills for this period warrant no 31508-31521 totaling \$47,126.09. Roll Call: Mr. Weller: yes, Mr. Miller: yes, Mr. Craig: yes, Ms. Morgan: yes, Ms. Gisewite: yes, Ms. Attaway: yes. MOTION PASSED.

PLANNING/ SERVICE COMMITTEES

Ms. Attaway reported that the Planning and Service Committees met this evening and discussed the Center Street parking. The committees discussed limiting business district parking to 2 hours from 8-5 Monday-Friday along Center Street from Taylor to Broadway; the availability of off street parking for residents living in that area was also discussed. The committees discussed the Village accepting the Country Crossing Subdivision into the Village Maintenance Program; Mr. Sears reported that the Village does remove the snow in the subdivision and that it is 60% built out; there was additional discussion about water leaks that must be remediated and the issues with the water retention pond.

MAYORS COMMENTS: No comment.

VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR REPORT:

Mr. Sears discussed the Code Red program and the percentage of residents that were recently notified by the system; there was additional discussion about other ways for residents to opt into the notifications. He reported that the Village had received a load of salt and that the supply was good now. He discussed the Dean Drive paving project and provided an update on the progress of the cell phone tower.

All formal actions of the Council and relating to the adoption of resolutions and/or motions passed at this meeting were adopted in a meeting open to the public, in compliance with the law, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.


ADJOURN:
