We have been very successful over the last several years in receiving grants to support the various infrastructure projects.


We are planning a "State of Village" update this winter. This is part of our continuing effort to expand our communication efforts to the local community. More information will be made available once a date is established.

Leaf Pickup

Leaf pickup will begin sometime during the month of October or November depending on the weather. Contact the Village Office for exact dates. As a



reminder, do
not rake leaves
into the curb,
as this will
impede the
flow of water
in the storm
sewers and
cause flooding.

Please rake leaves to an open area where they are accessible to the street crew, not behind parked cars, mailboxes, trees, shrubs, etc. Leaves mixed with grass clippings will not be removed.

Water and Sewer Rate Increase

On August 13, 2007, the Village Council passed an ordinance to increase the water and sewer rates for the next 5 years effective September 2007. The water rate was increased by 8% and the sewer rate was increased by 4%. We are currently into the fifth year of this plan. The water rate will increase to \$23.63 and the sewer rate will increase to \$24.71. Water and sewer rates for customers outside the village limits will remain at 1.5 times the rates established for village residents.

The Northeast Waterline - Phase II Project began October 1st. This project includes the installation of a new water line along Elm Street and east to Carolyn Drive and along Carolyn Drive from the intersection of Dean Drive, south to Hemple Road.
