FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT:

Mrs. Schenck discussed the ordinance amending the 2016 permanent appropriations.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

Mr. Sears reported that the EPA annual inspection had gone very well and that Aaron was doing a good job. The only issues were minor violations of high levels. He discussed the capital improvement budget and the necessary WWTP upgrades. He reported that they had been working on a storm sewer north of Walnut Street and that a lift station had been vandalized; the parents of the kids involved are going to reimburse the Village for the repairs. Mr. Sears reported that the old pickup truck had been sold. He has been working on a grant from DP & L for new streetlights in the business district. He discussed the recent water main work on Apple Drive; Prograde performed the necessary repair work. The current set up is a dead end and it needs to be a loop; he is hoping to include this in Center Street Improvements Phase IV.

FISCAL OFFICER REPORT: No further report.
