### VILLAGE OF FARMERSVILLE Minutes of Village Council Meeting August 14, 2017

The Farmersville Village Council met in regular session on August 14, 2017 in the Village of Farmersville Council Chambers at 117 E. Walnut Street. #### **Visitors Comments**

Park Board Representative Tom Izor provided a report on the activities at the park. He reported that the pond had been stocked with fish and that the community Center had been renovated. He reported that the Park Board had received a grant to improve handicap accessibility at the baseball diamonds and that work is expected to be completed by the fall. He stated that the park restrooms need to be renovated maybe this year or next. He reported that it had been a tough year at the pool. It was a rainy summer and there had been problems with the young, inexperienced staff. The pool filter sand needs to be replaced, it should be done every five years and this is year seven; the pool is using a lot more chemicals as a result. The pool heaters have run most of the summer. The cameras are not working. He reported that some decisions need to be made about the baby pool. It has a terrible leak that will require concrete demolition to replace the defective pipes. He stated that the Village and the Township may want to consider creating a splash pad in that area as an alternative.

Choice One Engineering Representative Matt Hoying discussed the Hemple Road Project Phase III. He explained that this will finish Hemple Road to the corporation limit. The Village will be required to contribute 26% of local revenues or in-kind work to the \$504,518 project.

Chief Schade reminded everyone that school starts on Wednesday.

#### Fire Association Report

Chief Wallace provided an update on the weather warning sirens and reported that FABA has ice cream for sale. The circus will return to town on May 2, 2018.

# Fiscal Officer Report

Ms. Schenck reported that she had transferred \$98,000 from the money market account to the STAR Ohio investment account. She had also certified the levy legislation to the Montgomery County Board of Elections. She reported that the June income tax revenue was behind 25% compared to 2016; in July the revenues are only 21% behind. She will continue to monitor the revenue and keep Council informed.

Mayor Weller reported that there was a new income tax bill introduced at the state level. Mr. Dowden asked how we could collect income tax from transient vendors; discussion ensued.

# Administrator Report

Mr. Sears reported that the Hemple Road Phase II was wrapping up. The Village staff had removed all of the old hydrants and installed new hydrants at the park. The backflows have been installed and the EPA was satisfied. The EPA recommended that the Village should start planning for a third water well. Mr. Sears discussed possibly purchasing 2 acres from Mrs. Stiver for it. There was additional discussion.
