

**VILLAGE OF FARMERSVILLE**  
**Minutes of Village Council Meeting**  
**May 29, 2018**

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The Farmersville Village Council met in regular session on May 29, 2018 in the Village of Farmersville Council Chambers at 117 E. Walnut St. Mayor Weller called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm; Mayor Weller led the group in prayer; the Pledge of Allegiance was recited and followed by a roll call.

**FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT:**

Ms. Schenck reported that the Finance Committee met this evening and reviewed the monthly reports and signed the bank reconciliations. She explained that the current 1.5 mil street levy was expiring at the end of the year and must be renewed; she will prepare legislation for the next meeting. She reported that revenues and expenditures were as expected.

**ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:**

Mr. Edds reported that the transfer switch has been installed at the water plant. The volleyball nets have been hung at the park. The Elm Street lift station has been repaired, the crew found a faulty motor starter and check valve. The crew worked at the pool due to several maintenance issues and replaced a skimmer pump and a motor starter. Mr. Edds reported that the Village had lost a great asset in Mr. Buzbee, Mr. Edds will be starting to interview applicants. The Village was approved for the CDBG to make the sidewalks ADA compliant, Mr. Edds will get bids for the work.. He reported that the Village will offer the information contained in the Consumer Confidence Report electronically instead of printing the report and mailing it. This will keep the Village in compliance and save money. The Montgomery County inmates worked at Depot Pointe Park; it looks great. The first permits have been filed with NIC.

Mr. Roach announced that he will not be able to attend the next meeting.


Mr. Lamb will invite the representative who designs the streetlight military banners to an upcoming meeting.
