Minutes of Village Council Meeting

March 28th, 2022

On Monday, March 28th, 2022, The Farmersville Village Council met in regular session, Mayor Nick Lamb called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and followed by roll call.

POLICE DEPARTMENT COMMENTS: none

FIRE ASSOCIATION COMMENTS: Chief Erisman reports the Easter egg hunt will be April 16th at 2:00pm at the park. He asked the Village Council for a donation to go towards the egg hunt. Chief Erisman discussed nuclear preparedness for the Village. Wright-Patterson Airforce Base is 22 miles from Farmersville. Fallout can reach 23 miles. Fallout from a nuclear attack on Wright-Patt could reach Farmersville. Residents would have approximately 20 minutes to shelter. The Valley View Junior High can be used as a shelter for residents.

LAW DIRECTOR COMMENTS: Ms. Knight reports she has looked over lease for 44 Maple. The lease needs to state the tenant will pay for utilities. The lease also needs to state the list of upgrades the tenant will perform in exchange for four months of rent paid.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT: Ms. Schenck reports the water and sewer funds are not reflecting the utility increase. She will check the 1st quarter report to check for the increase. Ms. Schenck will have the 1st quarter report at the next finance committee meeting. Ms. Schenck reports Ms. Marascio has been entering receipts since the beginning of the year. Ms. Schenck will begin to train Ms. Marascio on payroll. Ms. Schenck reports the water fund was \$225,000 and the sewer fund was\$177,00 at the end of 2021.

MAYOR COMMENTS: Mayor Lamb suggests Tom Izor should be recognized for his service to the Joint Farmersville/Jackson Township Park. Mr. Izor served on the park board for 17 ½ years.

VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR REPORT: Mr. Shell reports the aeration tower has been cleaned. The watermain replacement of California St has started and seems to be going well. Mr. Shell reports the EPA performed a routine inspection on the wastewater treatment plant. The EPA suggest upgrading the WWTP based on existing usage. The upgrade could potentially cost approximately one million dollars.

Mr. Shell reports he will wait on the installation of the microscreen, which was estimated to cost \$80,000 and was included in the 2022 budget. An upgrade to the WWTP would change the status of the plant from Class I to Class II. Mr. Shell issued 1 zoning violation for this period. Mr. Shell reports the village crew planted a blue spruce evergreen tree at Depot Pointe Park. The tree will be used for the annual Christmas tree lighting.

LEGISLATION: Mayor Lamb read Resolution No. 2022-1. A resolution to withdraw from the Joint Recreation Board to administrator parks and recreation for the Village of Farmersville, and the unincorporated areas of Jackson Township. (first reading)

OLD BUSINESS:

Mr. Holderman moved, Mr. Cunningham seconded to approve a donation of \$100.00 to the Farmersville Fire Association for the annual Easter Egg hunt. Roll Call: Mr. Lewis; yes, Mr. Holderman; yes, Mr. Craig; yes, Mr. Cunningham; yes. MOTION PASSED.
