FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT: Ms. Marascio presented the 1st quarter report. Ms. Marascio reports income tax collection YTD is \$44,793.22. The water fund YTD received \$65,205.95, the sewer fund YTD received \$61,015.04 and the refuse fund YTD received \$21,835.56. The water and sewer collections are slightly above the estimated revenue and refuse is slightly lower than estimated revenue. Ms. Marascio reported that she received two notices from IRS. The notices stated federal withholdings and 941 forms were paid late and filed late resulting in penalties and interest. The notices were from 1st quarter of 2022 and 2nd quarter of 2022. The finance committee suggest implementing a policy to ensure the federal withholding and filing the 941 forms are done on time to avoid these penalties and interest moving forward.

At 7:14pm, Mr. Cunningham moved, Mr. Lewis seconded to adjourn to executive session under the authority of O.R.C. 121.11 (1) to consider the appointment, employment, dismissal, discipline, promotion, demotion, or compensation of a public employee or official. The grant will be used for decorative street lighting, the actual cost for the lighting will be approximately \$40,000.
